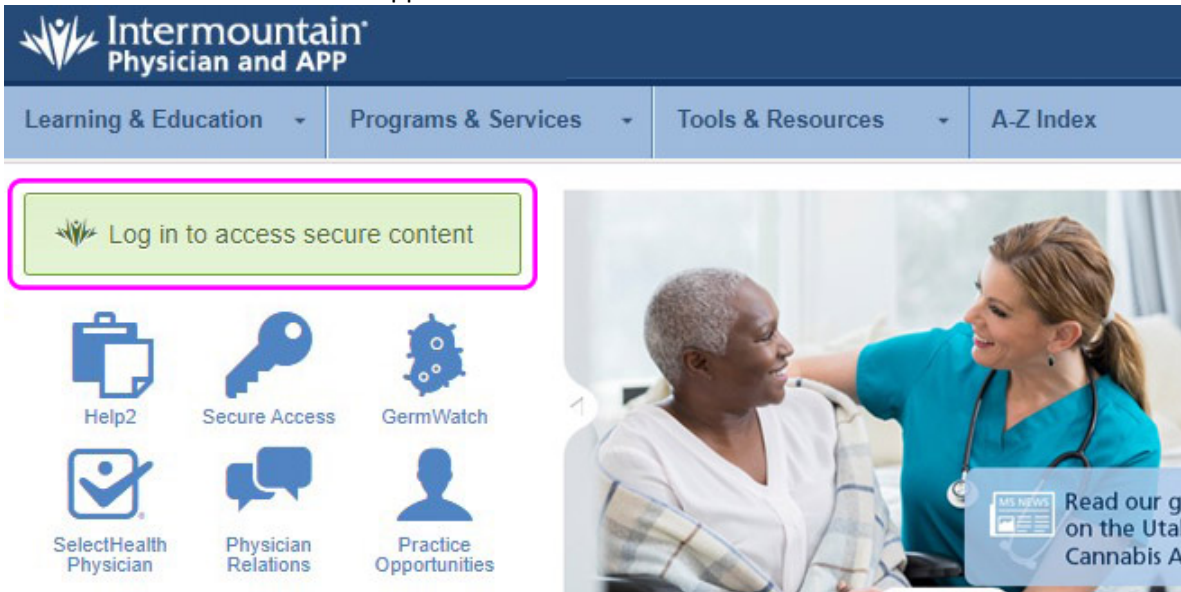


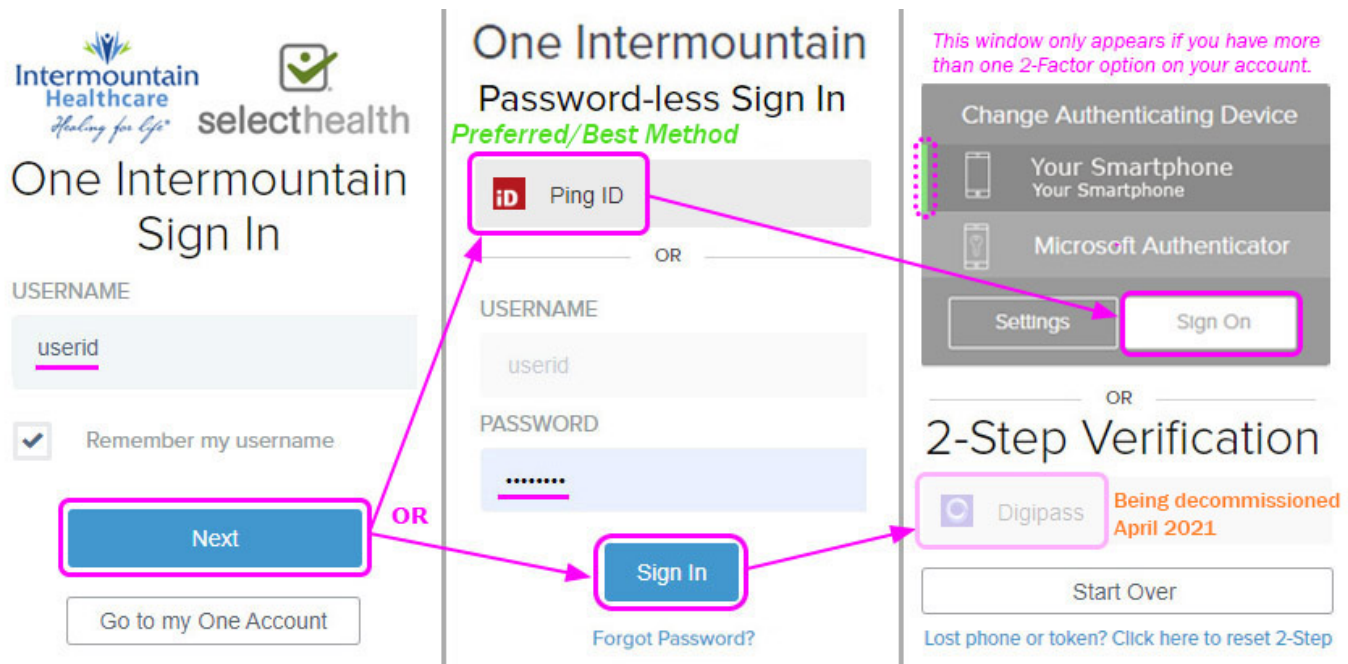
Intermountain Physician Portal (intermountain.net) Access Steps

If you haven't already set up the PingID 2-Factor Verification app on your smartphone, please go to the Affiliated Support Site <https://ihchelp.info> -> **2-Factor Auth / DSA Portal / Physician Portal Resources** -> **Option 1** and step through the Setup Guide. Once PingID is in place, you will be able to access the Physician Portal.

1. Go to URL: <http://intermountainphysician.org> (where you should see a page similar to the one below) and click **Log in to access secure content** in the upper left corner:



2. In the window that appears, enter your Intermountain userid or imail2.org address (if known/available) and, if this is a personal device and if preferred, check the *Remember my username* box then click **Next**. Click **PingID**, then **Sign On**, and authenticate in PingID to complete login:



Accessing Clinical Resources (eResources) on the Intermountain Physician Portal

Once logged into the Physician Portal, here is how to access the various Clinical Resources, typically referred to as *eResources* in HELP2 & iCentra/PowerChart:

1. Click *Tools & Resources* in the top middle menu bar
2. Click *Clinical Resources*, which will open the Clinical Library page
- 3a. The *Clinical Resources* typically found in the iCentra eResources page are listed in the lower left column
- 3b. *More Clinical Resources* are accessed using the link at the bottom of the lower left column
- 3c. You can also use the *Search* box below the page title to search for a specific resource
